Pupils follow progressive literacy and numeracy programmes and are assessed in a range of ways including formative and summative assessments as well as observations and learning conversations.

Learners are motivated to share new learning and developing skills through an IDL context. Pupils across the school readily apply their talents to STEM projects producing great artefacts that reflect their creativity and wide range of Meta skills.
